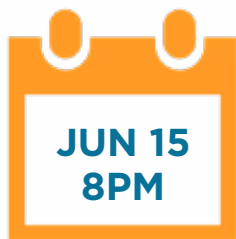

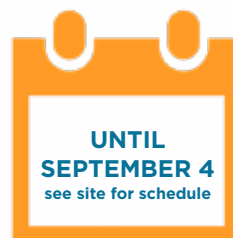

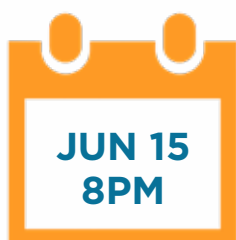

BRAZIL IS NOT JUST SÃO PAULO AND RIO

Brazil is a huge country - not just in size, but in the different kinds of cultures, people, and wildlife. Because Portugal, Spain, and the Netherlands colonized it, very specific parts of their cultures still continue in our present daily life. That's why my country - like many others - has distinct segments that are differentiated not just by climate, fauna, flora, and so forth, but also by culture.

Brazil is not just São Paulo and Rio. **The Brazilian territory is divided into five parts: North, Northeast, South, Southeast, and Central-West.** All of them are unique in their own way, especially with food. That's why you need to look very carefully before you choose your next destination.

IN THE NORTH: BELÉM DO PARÁ

Belém is the capital of Pará, a state that is known because it has **many ports** and it's an entrance to the lower part of Brazil. Mainly colonized by Portugal, Belém still continues to have a lot of the same architecture from the 1700s. That's why the main attractions of the city are colonial monuments such as public squares and streets that extend to the edge of the jungle.



The North part of the country is hot almost every month. But it's especially amazing between June and December because the dry season is ideal for outdoor events.

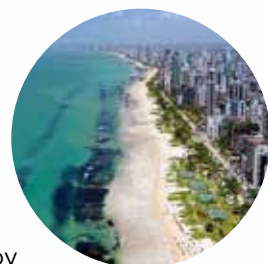
You can take the boat (since it's a port city) and enjoy a two-hour ride covering the entire coast of Estação das Docas.

The best place to stay in Belem depends on what you want to do there. If you prefer an eventful night life, Nazaré is your best option. But if you want to be closer to the heart of the city and the attractions, your best option is the Historic Center. Last but not least, if you prefer a safer space and to stay in the richest area, Umarizal is your best option.

You cannot leave without trying the Pastel de Belem, an incredible sweet dish that is 100% worth it.

NORTHEAST: RECIFE, PERNAMBUCO

Recife is the capital of Pernambuco and was founded during the first step of Portugal's colonization in 1537. Like Belém, Recife is a port city known by its **many rivers**, including the Capibaribe and Beberibe. Because of this, the city is also known as the Brazilian Venice.



Recife has many different kinds of places to visit because of the diverse group of people that colonized this part of the country. You can go crazy at the carnival, and the next day find yourself enjoying architecture at the Ricardo Brennand Institute.

Taking a drive to the coast side of the city, you can find several beaches minutes from each other - such as Boa Viagem beach and Paiva beach - and enjoy a caipirinha while chilling in the sun.

If you choose to go to the heart of the city, you can find more educational activities, such as Paço do Frevo (where you can learn about a type of dance really famous in Brazil and the culture of Carnaval), Cais



do Sertão (where you can learn about the life of the famous singer Luis Gonzaga and the story about the poor and deserted area in Pernambuco), and Teatro de Santa Isabel (where you can watch old movies about Brazilian culture).

CENTRAL-WEST: BRASILIA, DISTRITO FEDERAL



Brasilia is the only city that was entirely constructed for a specific purpose. President Juscelino Kubitschek (known as JK) designed it to become the nation's capital, and it was built to be occupied by way fewer people that she has now. Because Brasilia was originally laid out completely on paper before actually being built, it has some extraordinary pieces of architecture by some renowned architects.

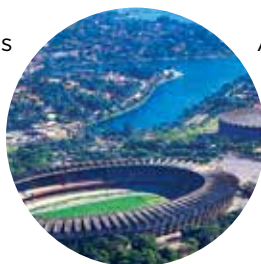
Their works include the Juscelino Kubitschek Bridge, Praça dos Cristais, Itamaray Palace, and Palacio do Planalto.

The city also has some **woodlands and parks**, including Jardim Botânico de Brasília, Parque da Cidade Sarah Kubitschek, and Lago do Paraná.

If you also want to know more about the Brazilian government and its political history, this is also the best place to do that, since it's where all the presidents have lived and governed since the late 1900s.

SOUTHEAST: BELO HORIZONTE, MINAS GERAIS

Belo Horizonte, like many other cities in Brazil, is known for her wildlife and **forests, surrounded by mountains.** That's why many of the sites in this area are parks such as Praça da Liberdade, Mirante Mangabeiras, and Memorial Minas Gerais Vale.



If you are really into Brazilian soccer or just soccer in general, you can still set up a visit to the Estádio Mineirão and watch a Brazilian soccer game like a true Brazilian, with beer and good friends.

And last but not least, if you are into religious places and good architecture, you can check out the Palacio

das Artes, Igreja São José, and Igreja São Francisco de Assis.

SOUTH: GRAMADO, RIO GRANDE DO SUL

Gramado was colonized by many Europeans after Brazil was "discovered." First came the Portuguese. Then the Germans arrived five years later, then the Italians. So it's also a great place for those who want to meet the **"European" part of Brazil.** Gramado is also a great place to bring the family for a getaway weekend, since almost everything is kid-friendly.



Gramado has a place called Mini Mundo, which is a collection of miniatures about the culture of Brazil as well as parts of other countries, interconnecting them by their similarities and differences.

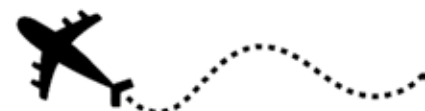
Gramado also has many parks - full of wildlife and greenery - my favorite of which is Lago Negro. You can take beautiful pictures and ride boats to see the whole park.

There's a lot to see in Gramado because every village has a different part of Europe. So you can be at the Italian side in 10 minutes and on the German side in the next five.

For lovers, I recommend seeing the Fonte do Amor Eterno because then you can declare all your love in a locket where you can put your initials together.

And since Gramado is part of the countryside - and the temperature is not actually very hot - it has good weather for grapes to flourish, for the best wine in Brazil. You can go to the Vinicola Ravanello to taste the wine and find out how it's made - from the mashing of grapes, to the actual production of the bottle.

As you can see, Brazil is a large country where you can be surprised by the differences and the great people. So before scheduling your next trip to Brazil, make a change of scenery. Try these cities next.



COME VISIT PORTUGAL

Portugal is a country with a lot of things to do. We have the most beautiful beaches and the biggest waves in the world. Also a big variety of food - in particular, sea food and wine - which differs between each part of Portugal. We also have a long history. Portugal is one of the oldest countries in Europe, so there are a lot of historical monuments to see. The three best known parts of Portugal are Porto in the north, Lisbon in the middle, and Algarve in the south. Each part has different typical food and different interests.

Here are some things to do in each district.

PORTO DISTRICT :

Some monuments to see: Ponte Luis I, Palacio da Bolsa, Porto Cathedral. There are also other close cities around Porto to visit. Braga is 30 min by car from Porto, and is very pretty. so is Lagoa, where you can see Cavao dos Conchos, which is an artificial lake.

LISBON DISTRICT:

Things to eat: Pasteis de nata are a speciality from there. You can find them at the Pasteis de Belem Bakery in front of the Belem Tower. There is usually a big line, but it is worth it. Another legendary place is Casa Portuguesa, for Pastels de Bacalhau. It's located in Rua Augusta, a famous street with a lot of shops and restaurants.

Monuments: Ponte de 25 abril, Sanctuario do Cristo Rei, Elevador Santa Justa, Praca do comercio, and Pink Street.

An hour from Lisbon by car is Setubal Municipality, with amazing beaches. My favorite is Galapinhos Beach, with white sand and hot and transparent water. Nazaré city has the biggest waves. It is a good spot to surf in winter. It is an hour and a half by car from Lisbon.

ALGARVE DISTRICT:

Algarve is the southern region of Portugal. It's also known for beautiful beaches. It includes all the cities in the south, the most famous of which is Albufeira - a good place to go with your friends. It's really alive at night. Beaches include Pescadores Beach. You can also go to Marina Port, where there are good places to eat. You can do a lot of activities such as skydiving, kayaking or boating into Benagil Caves (you can see dolphins), jeep safaris, and quad biking tours.

Quarteira and Vilamoura are also really famous cities. Next to them is an aquatic park called Aquashow Park.

**CHINA****KOREAN****JAPAN**

WHAT ARE SOME DIFFERENCES?

You may think that China, Korea and Japan have similar cultures and customs because they are neighboring countries. However, they have different aspects.

To begin with, eating habits are different. Japanese people tend to have mild tastes based on soy sauce. The typical foods, for example, are sushi, ramen and miso soup. On the other hand, Korean people are keen to eat kimchi with every meal. They eat it not only at home, but also in restaurants. Like kimchi, other Korean foods use red chili paste and red chili powder. In contrast, the taste of Chinese food depends on the area. For example, food in the northeast, such as in Dalian, is salty and spicy, while cuisine in the southeast, such as in Guangzhou, is mild.

Moreover, Japanese people and Korean people prefer to have cold drinks when the weather is hot. However, Chinese people always tend to drink warm or hot drinks, since they believe that cold drinks are bad for our bodies, according to Chinese medicine.

Secondly, there are differences in what to call friends and coworkers. In China and Korea, people tend to call their friends and colleagues “sister” or “brother” if the other is older. So in China, people call older men “ge” while they call older women “jie.” Korea is almost the same as China, but it is more complicated. Men call older men “hyon,” while women call older men “oppa.” And men call older women “nuna,” while women call older women “onni.” However, in Japan, people almost never call each other “sister” and “brother” if they are not siblings.

Last but not least, the three languages have many differences, even though they are from neighboring countries and the origins of the Japanese and Korean languages trace back to Chinese. Regarding the forms of letters, Chinese and Japanese have partially common letters. Japanese also added two more styles of characters, though. In contrast, Korean is totally different. Moreover, each language’s pronunciation is extremely different from the others, even though they have a few of the same pronunciations. Finally, in terms of grammar, Japanese and Korean are relatively similar, whereas Chinese is completely different. With regard to tense, Korean has past, present, and future, whereas Japanese does not have a future tense. In contrast, Chinese does not have any tense. It represents time using adverbs and so forth.

They wear traditional clothes, have stylish hair and carry a lot of weapons with them. Do not worry though. They are very kind and they will tell you the history of their people.



One of the most famous things to do is swim with the dolphins and afterwards, to go near the private island of Bill Gates - a beautiful spot. Nearby, you can dive near a sandbank, then take a break to eat fruit and drink. There are a lot of water activities. The guide might propose a jet ski ride, a boat trip with a group of musicians, etc. These are amazing ways to have a good time.

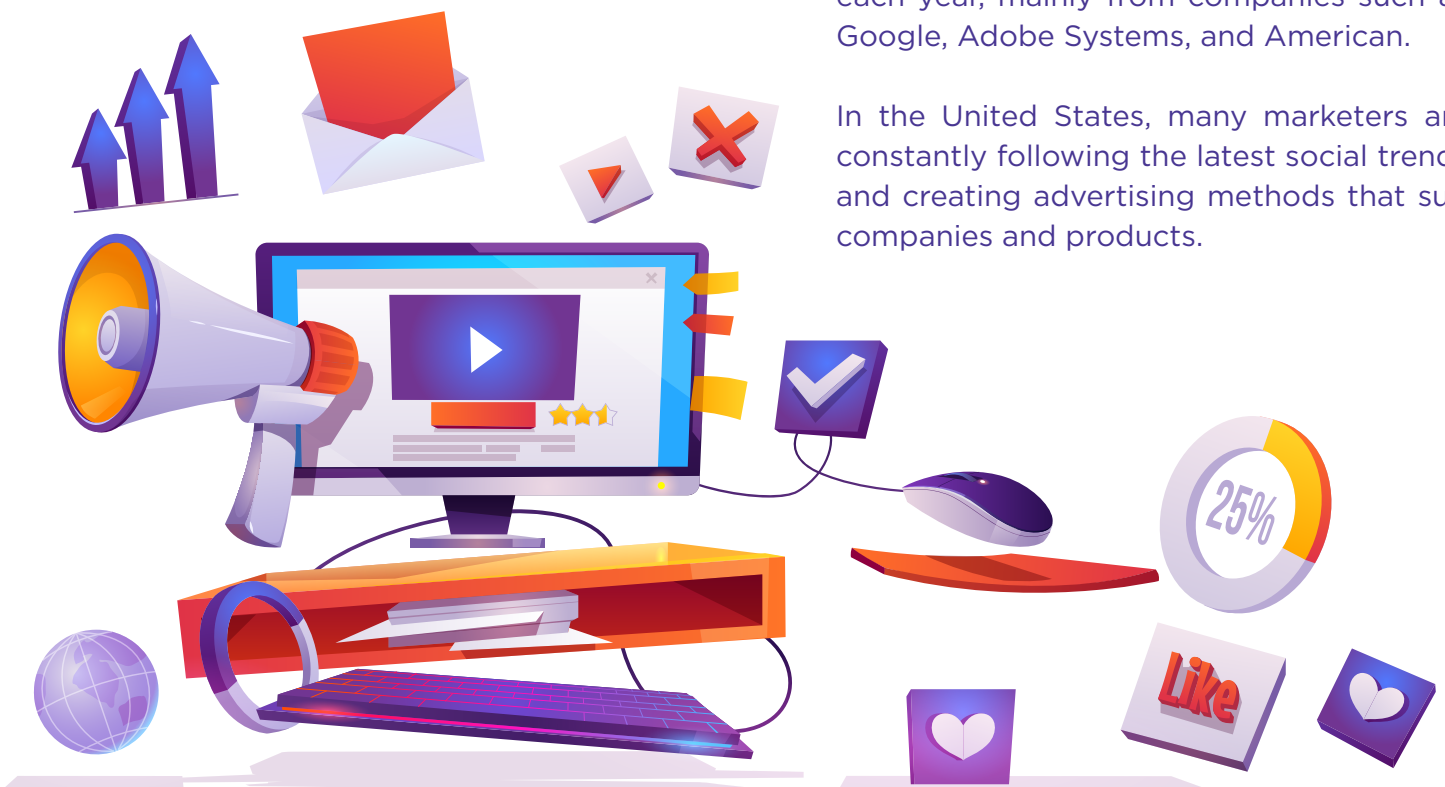
The work of the American marketing business is divided into food manufacturing, clothes, vehicles, and housing.

The second is the fireworks festival.

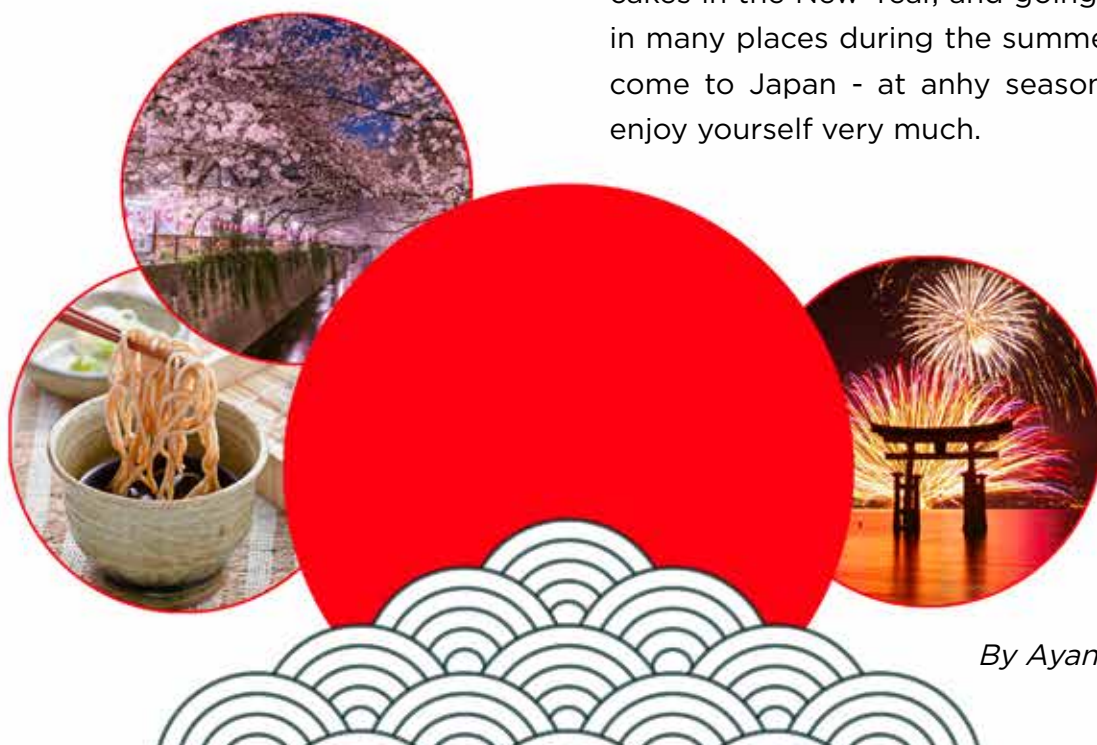
This event is held all over Japan from July to August every year. The fireworks viewing
