


SARDINIA MY ISLAND IN ITALY

1. Rashomon

It is not only excellent in content, but also in technique. He created beautiful contrast using techniques such as pointing the camera directly at the sun, which was taboo at that time. Due to these wonderful qualities, Rashomon has been praised around the world. It got the Academy Honorary Award



and the Golden Lion (the highest prize given to a movie at the Venice Film Festival). Surprisingly, however, Akira Kurosawa didn't attend either Academy Awards or Venice Film Festival and a passing tourist received the prize instead. Akira Kurosawa didn't even know it was being considered, because at that time Japan had no interest in Japanese movies going international. This movie made Japanese people realize that Japanese movies could expand internationally. This marked a major turning point for Japanese movies.

2. Spirited Away

Spirited Away is a movie that was released in 2001 by director Hayao Miyazaki. It is a story about a 10-year-old girl named Chihiro who is separated from her parents and works hard to survive on her own. This is one of the most popular Ghibli movies. GREAT UKRAINIANS FROM HISTORY



Ukraine is a country with a rich history and cultural heritage, offering many fascinating aspects for foreigners to explore. Today, I want to introduce you to some great, well-known Ukrainians throughout the world.

Remember the Christmas song, "Carol of the Bells"? It's one of the world's most iconic Christmas songs, and it has its roots in Ukraine. Based on

the ancient folk melody "Schedryk," which predates Christianity, the music was composed by Ukrainian genius Mykola Leontovych.


This song, initially a springtime folk tune, was first introduced internationally in 1910 and became a powerful symbol of Ukrainian culture and resilience. The English adaptation, "Carol of the Bells," emerged in 1936 and has since become a global Christmas favorite – though its origin was not for the winter season.

Then there is George Kistyakivsky, a Ukrainian physicist and

one of the developers of nuclear weapons.

Born in Boyarka, in the Kyiv region, he fled to Germany at the age of 20 to escape the

Bolsheviks. In Berlin, he obtained a degree in physics. After moving to the United States, Kistyakivsky became a professor at Harvard University. He joined the project to develop nuclear explosives, working on the firing mechanism for plutonium detonation, which was called the Kistyakivsky trigger. After a successful test in the American desert, he joined the international committee for nuclear disarmament, realizing his mistake in contributing to the creation of weapons of mass destruction.



He became an opponent of the U.S. government, resigned from all his positions, and continued teaching at Harvard. In his last interview, he emphasized that he was a Ukrainian, not a Russian, jokingly comparing it to calling a Scotsman an Englishman. In his hometown of Boyarka, a street was named after the Kistyakivsky family.

DIFFERENCES BETWEEN MEXICO AND JAPAN

How many countries have you visited in your life? Most people who love to travel say they can discover new things and get to know a new side of themselves while traveling. In this article, we will explain some interesting differences between two countries — Mexico (located in North America) and Japan (located in East Asia). It will help you plan your next exciting trip.

Food:

Mexican food is rich and diverse, featuring staples like tacos, sopes, huaraches and tamales. Traditional dishes often use ingredients such as corn, beans, chili peppers, and avocados.

Japanese food is based on the idea of respecting nature and is based on lightly seasoned dishes that bring out the natural flavors of the ingredients. Traditional Japanese dishes are characterized by cooking methods such as making soup with a common base such as seaweed, fish or soybean, simmering, steaming, and grilling. The main ingredients are white rice, fish, and vegetables (eg. sushi, bento, miso soup).

Customs:

In Mexico, the "Quinceañera" is a significant cultural celebration marking a girl's fifteenth birthday. It symbolizes her transition from childhood to womanhood and often includes a religious ceremony, a formal party, and traditional customs like the waltz and the changing of shoes.

In Japan, "Seijinshiki" is a traditional Japanese ceremony that celebrates 20 year old people! They are usually held on the national holiday and are held by the local government. On this day, young people who have just turned 20 years old appear in long-sleeved kimonos and suits, and enter a new stage as adults. The ceremony includes many activities such as lectures, commemorative photos, and attractions. Recently, Japan has changed the adult age to 18 years old. This celebration continues to recognize when young people become adults.



Music:

Mexican music is diverse, encompassing genres like Mariachi, Banda, Norteño, and Ranchera. Mariachi, with its lively rhythms and stringed instruments, is especially iconic, often featuring traditional songs that are both festive and expressive of Mexican culture and heritage. Japanese music is called "J-POP" and includes a variety of genres such as rock and idol songs. This style emphasizes the singing voice and lyrics rather than rhythm. It usually has a set format of intro, A melody, B melody, and chorus, with the chorus being the most exciting part.

JAPANESE THE DIFFERENT ALPHABETS, THE DIFFERENT LANGUAGES

Learning Japanese is not only about learning the language, but it's also an enjoyable journey into various aspects of Japan. The Japanese language has many interesting aspects. One of them is that there are three types of characters: Kanji, Hiragana, and Katakana. Hiragana is used to express Japanese grammar, while Katakana is used to write words from foreign countries or special words. A single Kanji character can express a variety of meanings. For example, the Kanji character **\mathbb{H}** has many meanings including "hi" (day, sun) and "nichi" (date).

The Japanese language also has a special language called "Keigo." Using Keigo is a way to show respect to the person you are speaking to. For example, in the same act of eating, one says 召し上がる (meshiagaru) to a superior, and 頂く (itadaku) to oneself in a humble manner. This distinction in language usage is not often seen in other languages.
